

All Saturday matches were played at the Winnipeg Soccer Federation indoor soccer field on the University of Manitoba campus due to snow covered fields. All matches were 60 minutes in length, separated into 30 minute halves.

GROUP B (Boys)

AB 0:0 QC (Boys)

Alberta and Québec opened the day with a fiercely contested 0:0 draw. While both teams created numerous opportunities to score, neither was able to finish their chances. With the draw, Québec finished first in group B and advanced to Sunday's semi-final. Alberta finished second in the group and was forced to wait on later results to determine whether they would join Québec in the semi-finals as the best second place team.

NB 3:0 YK (Boys)

New Brunswick defeated Yukon Territory 3:0 on Saturday afternoon. New Brunswick goals were scored by Alex Fredericks, Thomas Maclean, and Zachary Wood-Sesems. With the victory New Brunswick finished third in Group B with three points, while Yukon Territory finished bottom of the group on zero points.

GROUP C (Girls)

ON 1:0 AB (Girls)

Ontario defeated Alberta in a battle of Group C leaders on Saturday. With the three points Ontario jumped ahead of Alberta to finish first in Group C and guarantee themselves a place in Sunday's semi-final. Ontario's Jainudeen Shannon broke the 0-0 deadlock in the 42nd minute after breaking through the Alberta defense. Alberta Goalkeeper Mariah Hoy got a hand on Shannon's high drive but was unable to keep it out of the net.

NB 1:1 NL (Girls)

New Brunswick and Newfoundland Labrador played to a 1:1 draw on Saturday afternoon. New Brunswick took 1-0 first half lead on a perfectly placed free-kick from Marissa Duguay. Duguay curled her 25 yard effort over the Newfoundland Labrador wall and into the top left corner of the goal. Rebecca Green pulled Newfoundland Labrador even with a well taken goal on 42 minutes. Newfoundland Labrador finish in third position in Group C while New Brunswick finish fourth after the conclusion of group play.

GROUP C (Boys)

NS 1:0 PE (Boys)

Nova Scotia defeated Prince Edward Island 1:0 in a battle of Maritime Provinces on Saturday. Nova Scotia took a first half lead on a goal from Ahmed Alhattab. Prince Edward Island pressed hard for a second half equalizer, including hitting the crossbar with under 15 minutes remaining, but could not find the tying goal. With the win Nova Scotia finished in third position in Group C while Prince Edward Island finished bottom of the group.

MB(1) 0:3 ON (Boys)

Ontario scored two goals inside the first five minutes and never looked back as they cruised to a 3:0 victory over Manitoba on Saturday night. The first half was continuous one-way traffic as Ontario repeatedly broke through the Manitoba backline. Manitoba responded with a strong second half but it was too little to late. With the victory Ontario finishes in first place in Group C. Manitoba finished in second position.

GROUP B (Girls)

MB(1) 4:0 YK (Girls)

Manitoba eased by Yukon Territory 4:0 late on Saturday night. Following a slow start, possibly due to an 11:40 pm start, Manitoba picked up steam in the second half to capture second place in Group B. NS 0:0 BC (Girls)

The Nova Scotia players celebrated wildly at the final whistle blew as the tie guaranteed Nova Scotia finished top of Group B. British Columbia meanwhile had to wait until the final round of Group B matches to determine their final standing.

GROUP A (Boys)

NL 0:1 MB(2) (Boys)

Takuro Mizuno scored the lone goal in a 1:0 victory for Manitoba over Newfoundland Labrador on Saturday night. The 1-0 victory vaulted Manitoba into first place in Group A and a place in Sunday's semi-finals. The Manitoba club, Winnipeg South End United,

was participating in the National Championships as the “guest team” as Manitoba is the hosting province for the Adidas U-16 Cup. Manitoba will face Alberta in Sunday’s semi-final. Newfoundland Labrador finishes bottom of Group A and will face Prince Edward Island in the 9th – 12th positional play-off.

BC 3:2 SK (Boys)

British Columbia outlasted Saskatchewan 3:2 in an entertaining back and forth game on Saturday evening. Saskatchewan took a 1-0 lead into half-time thanks to a Ryan Schmidt marker. BC came out strong to start of the second half and were rewarded for their positive play with the tying goal in the 35th minute from a long range effort. Saskatchewan wasted little time in retaking the lead as Ryan Schmidt scored his second of the match on a deflected free kick. Incredibly, British Columbia responded with two late second half goals to take the match 3-2. With the win British Columbia took the lead in Group A pending the result from later games. GROUP A (Girls)
