

All Sunday matches were played at the Winnipeg Soccer Federation indoor soccer field on the University of Manitoba campus due to snow covered fields. All matches were 60 minutes in length, separated into 30 minute halves.

9 – 12 Placing (Boys)

NB(1) 3:1 YK

Roy Mugume scored a hat-trick and New Brunswick earned their place in the 9/10th playoff with a 3:1 victory over Yukon Territory Sunday morning. The opening match of the day developed into an open game as both teams committed to playing attacking soccer. Caleb Kelly scored the lone Yukon goal in the match. Yukon Territory will play in the 11/12 play-off on Monday.

NL 0:0 PE (PE wins 4:2 on penalty kicks)

Prince Edward Island defeated Newfoundland and Labrador on penalty kicks to move into the 9/10th playoff on Monday. Neither team was able to score in regulation time moving the match directly to penalty kicks. In the penalty kick session Prince Edward Island shot first, scored first, and converted four of their five penalty kicks to beat Newfoundland and Labrador 4-2. Prince Edward Island will face New Brunswick for 9/10th position while Newfoundland and Labrador will face Yukon Territory for 11/12th.

9 – 12 Placing (Girls)

PE 1:2 YU

Yukon Territories recorded its first win of the tournament defeating Prince Edward Island by a score of 2:1. After the teams traded first half goals, the match seemed destined to be heading towards penalty kicks before Odette Rivard capitalized on a PEI defensive miscue to score the game winning goal. Yukon will now play for 9/10th position while Prince Edward Island will play for 11/12th.

NB 2:0 MB(2)

New Brunswick defeated Manitoba(2) 2:0 Saturday afternoon. Both of New Brunswick's goals were scored in the second half. Danielle Daley and Julie McGraw were the goal scorers. New Brunswick will now face Yukon Territory for 9/10th position while Manitoba(2) will face Prince Edward Island for 11/12th.

1-4 Placing (Boys)

MB(2) 0:3 AB

Alberta reached the gold medal match at the adidas U-16 Cup with a solid 3:0 win over Manitoba(2). Forward Jevan Bailey was the focal point of Alberta's attack throughout the match. It was Bailey who opened the scoring on six minutes after he caught inside from the left and blasted an unstoppable shot into the right hand corner of the Manitoba(2) net. Alberta doubled their lead in the 10th minute as Bailey turned provider when he found Connor Distefano alone in the box and Distefano made no mistake. Alberta put the match out of reach as Chris Royal scored in the second half. Manitoba(2) will face Ontario on Monday for the bronze medal.

QC 0:0 ON (QC wins 4:3 on penalty kicks)

Québec outlasted Ontario to win on penalty kicks in a highly anticipated semi-final match up. With the victory Québec advances to the gold medal match against Alberta on Monday. In a match that featured few clear cut scoring opportunities, Ontario came closest to scoring in regulation when they smashed a 25 yard free kick off the crossbar in the opening minutes. With the adjusted indoor rules, the match moved directly to penalty kicks following the completion of the second half. A hush came over the large, boisterous crowd as each player strode forward to take the penalty kicks. Québec scored on four of their five kicks to defeat Ontario who missed their 1st and 3rd kicks. Ontario will now face Manitoba(2) in the bronze medal match on Monday.

1-4 Placing (Girls)

QC 1:0 AB

Joelle Gosselin provided all the offense Québec needed as they defeated Alberta 1:0 in their semi-final match on Sunday. Gosselin scored from a free kick early in the first half and Québec's strong defense took them the rest of the way. Québec will face Ontario for the gold medal on Monday while Alberta will face Nova Scotia in the bronze medal match.

NS 0:1 ON

Shannen Jainudeen scored on a rebound with less than ten minutes to play as Ontario sealed their passage to the gold medal final on Monday. Ontario carried much of the play throughout the match but we're unable to break through Nova Scotia's determined defense. Just as the match appeared to be headed to penalty kicks, Jainudeen was the first to react in the box and bury the juicy rebounded. Ontario will now face Québec in the gold medal match while Nova Scotia will face Alberta for the bronze medal.

5 – 8 Placing (Boys)

MB(1) 0:0 NS (NS wins 4:2 on penalty kicks)

Nova Scotia defeated Manitoba(1) on penalty kicks to earn the right to face British Columbia for 5/6th position. With the win Nova Scotia earned revenge for their 0:4 loss to Manitoba(1) in Group C play. Nova Scotia's penalty taking was clinical as they converted all four of their kicks to defeat Manitoba(1) 4:2. Manitoba(1) will face Saskatchewan for 7/8th position on Monday.

BC 2:0 SK

British Columbia beat Saskatchewan for the second consecutive day to advance to the 5/6th play off. British Columbia got goals on either side of halftime from Troy Holmes and Adam Jones in the victory. With the loss Saskatchewan will face Manitoba(1) in the 7/8th playoff on Monday.

5 – 8 Placing (Girls)

MB(1) 1:0 NL

Manitoba(1) earned a hard fought 1:0 victory over Newfoundland Labrador on Sunday night. Manitoba's Anisha Kinnarath scored her fifth goal of the tournament early in the first half to lead Manitoba to victory. Both sides had opportunities to score in the second half, although neither could convert. With the victory Manitoba will play for 5/6th place while Newfoundland Labrador will play for 7/8th on Monday.

SK 2:0 BC

Saskatchewan netted two second half goals to beat British Columbia in the last game on Sunday. Rebecca Zbitniff and Samantha Matheson scored for Saskatchewan in the win. Saskatchewan will face Manitoba(1) for 5/6th position while British Columbia faces Newfoundland Labrador for 7/8th position on Monday.
